

<u>Replacement Documents for Veterans and surviving spouses</u>. It is important that each Veteran have a copy of his DD 214, there are a variety of benefits that require proof of Service, especially the VA. If you need help in getting a DD 214 or Report of Separation. CDR Jim and the Quartermaster can assist in the process. We can go on line and request the documents for Veterans, a surviving spouse, or a family member. Once the request is submitted, the Veteran or surviving spouse must sign a request which we will fax to the appropriate department. We will need basic information on the veteran such as service number, branch of service, date of service, where served, address, phone number, etc. Cdr Jim and the QM will be glad to assist. This is easy; take advantage of this service. If you are a widow, Veteran or surviving Family member please use the service so you have a copy of the document. Doing it after the fact or in time of Stress is difficult on all.

Independance Day July 4th On this day in 1776, the Declaration of Independence was approved by the Continental Congress, setting the 13 colonies on the

road to freedom as a sovereign nation. As always, this most American of holidays will be marked by parades, fireworks and backyard barbecues across the country. Social Secruity note: When a person passes and they were social security eligible; they are entitled to Social Security Death Benefits. The catch is you have to apply for the money. You have to call Social Security and set up an appointment (by phone or at the Social Security Office) to apply for the benefit. It does not happen automatically with the passing and notification to Social Security. You have to APPLY within two years.

Legal Clinic SITREP May 18th : HRT Veteran Legal Clinic SITREP for Saturday May 18, 2013. Our JAG, Craig Candelore with Rich Allison, a Marine Veteran and certified paralegal, who administers the program, and Howard Thomas, Esq. a Army Special Forces veteran helped conduct the Clinic.


1 USA vet seeking help with recent girlfriend that is harassing him for the fast several months. His girlfriend works at the VA and has access to his personal records and knows when his appointments are and shows up at them when he wants privacy from her. He has complained to the VA and they have done nothing and feels violated and that his rights are being ignored. He was advised to get a Domestic Violence Restraining Order against her and include all the support he has for the restraining order like witness declarations. We explained where to go and how to obtain a DVTRO. Once he has a court order for a DVTRO he needs to make the VA administration formally aware of the DVTRO and the VA will have to comply with this court order.

2nd issue: He was temporarily upgraded from 40% to 100% due to several medical problems with his feet. Before his rehabilitative therapy finished, the VA downgraded him from 100% disabled to 40% disabled. The downgraded seems to be arbitrary. His treating physicians corroborate that he still has severe problem with his feet which keep him from standing for any length of time. He was advised to see Marilyn Maxwell at the VFW Mission Valley Center and seek to be reevaluated. Given the seriousness of his condition, he would probably qualify for at least 70% VA disability and un-employability.

2. USA vet seeking help with getting his OTH upgraded. However, he did not bring in his DD-214 or info regarding the incident. He was advised to bring in his DD-214 and we offered him a 'records request' form to fill out so he could get copies of all of his service records so he can see what is adverse in his personnel records against him. He served for three years. He stated that his first two years went well and he had good evaluations but the last year things went downhill. He stated that his company chain of command 'dogged' him even though he felt he did a good job. Since his discharge was recent, he is still in contact with soldiers what served with him in his unit. He was advised to make contact with any and all in his unit who could give him a good letter of recommendation. Craig Candelore Esq.

Post Home Behavior: In past newsletters this issue has been addressed a variety of ways.
