


Poppy Program:

Stand Down 2014

What is a Stand Down? In times of war, exhausted combat units requiring time to rest and recover were removed from the battlefields to a place of relative security and safety. Today, Stand Down refers to a community-based intervention program designed to help the nation's estimated 200,000 homeless veterans "combat" life on the streets. VVSD organized the nation's first Stand Down in 1988. Since then, the program has been widely replicated na-

Stand Downs take place across the country every year. "The program has become recognized as the most valuable outreach tool to help homeless veterans in the nation today," according to the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans. Stand Down's philosophy is a hand up, not a hand out. The hand up is made possible each year by the dedication of thousands of volunteers and numerous sponsors. Perhaps most important of all is the feeling of



safety. For the

first time in possibly days, weeks or even months our homeless brothers and sisters can leave their possessions in the care of others and rest. Stand Down is a place of miracles. Lives are changed and lives are saved. The founders of Stand Down had a dream. They made it a reality, one which continues to offer a true stand down for all homeless veterans. Protect Your Assets:

I locked my car with my remote. As I walked away, I heard my car door unlock. I went back and locked my car again three times. Each time, as soon as I started to walk away, I would hear it unlock again!! Naturally alarmed, I looked around and there were two guys sitting in a car in the fire lane next to the store. They were obviously watching me intently, and there was no doubt they were somehow involved in this very weird situation. I quickly changed my mind about doing the errand, turned around, jumped back in my car and sped away. I went straight to the police station, told them what had happened, and found out I was part of a new, and very successful, scheme being used to gain entry into cars. The police said I had been a victim of the latest robbery tactic -- there is a device that robbers are using now to clone your security code when you lock your doors on your car using your key-chain locking device. They sit a distance away and watch for their next victim. They know you are going inside of the store, restaurant, or bathroom and that they now have a few minutes to steal and run. The police officer said to manually lock your car door-by hitting the lock button inside the car -- that way if there is someone sitting in a parking lot watching for their next victim, it will not be you. When you hit the lock button on your car upon exiting, it does not send the security code. But if you walk away and use the door lock on your key chain, it sends the code through the airwaves where it can be instantly stolen.

Summer Health Tips:

Sun protection is important all year round, not just during the summer or at the beach. Take steps to help prevent skin cancer and other conditions. Heat-related deaths and illness are preventable, yet many people succumb to extreme heat each year. Take steps to lower your risk for heat-related illness.

- When possible, avoid outdoor activities during midday, when the sun's rays are strongest.
- Cover up with clothing and a wide-brimmed hat to protect exposed skin.
- Drink plenty of cool, non-alcoholic fluids.
- Seek shade. & Wear sunscreen and lip screen with (SPF) of 15 or higher. Remember to reapply it as often.

I will start by saying we remain solvent. We are having trouble with discretionary money availability, which means less to spend on the nice to have things and programs.

The City of San Diego, led by Todd Gloria is attempting to raise the minimum wage above the State mandated level (July 1 - \$9.00, Jan 1 \$10.00). VFW Post 3787 sent Council member Mr. Sherman a letter saying VFW Post 3787 opposes Gloria's social engineering program and if passed it would cause severe impacts on the operation of VFW Post 3787. Gloria wanted the City of San Diego to raise the minimum wage in San Diego to almost \$14.00. The impact would be increased costs of insurance. Workman's Comp, Payroll taxes, etc. The Post is not in a fiscal position to pay all

these increases. The City did not pass the \$14.00 minimum wage, but now Todd Gloria is considering an \$11.00 minimum wage. This issue has far reaching impacts on the continued viability of VFW Post 3787. One of the real tragedies of this process is Todd Gloria is not allowing the people of San Diego to even vote on the issue. I will try to keep you up to Date with the status of the City's plans.

If you see Capt Jack, tell him congratulations as he has qualified as an All State Commander and will be awarded his White Hat at the State Convention. He has done so well with membership and programs that it appears he will be awarded All American Post at the National Convention in St Louis. Well Done Capt Jack.
