

POW /MIA National Recognition Day:

POW/MIA Recognition Day (September 20) is a day of remembrance and hope for the speedy and safe return of American Prisoners of War, and those still Missing in Action. It also seeks the return of the remains of fallen soldiers.

The first official commemoration of POW/MIAs was July 18, 1979. It was the result of resolutions passed in Congress. The first national ceremony was held on this date. Over the next several years, it was held in varying dates of the year. Finally, in 1986, The National League of Families proposed the third Friday in September as a day to recognize and remember POW/MIAs. This date was selected, as it is not associated with any wars. Each year, the president of the United States issues a proclamation on this day. See below for information

Dollars & Cents:

I write this article to help all members understand the Canteen Business Model changes VFW Post 3787 has put into effect in August. There seems to be some confusion and misinformation about exactly what this means and how it impacts our great

bartenders. As I have written in previous articles I was very concerned with the State of California's minimum wage increases and our ability to continue to have paid employees. Now the City of San Diego has implemented increases that make the situation for VFW Post more critical. After a great deal of thought and debate, the decision was reached to (1) Change the Canteen Manager's position from hourly employment to a salaried position and remove the paid leave benefit, (2) no longer have bartenders on an hourly payroll, (3) have all bartenders be volunteers to VFW Post 3787 and (4) provide a Travel allowance to each Volunteer Bartender for offset the cost of traveling to and from the Post for each shift.

The 4 items have been accomplished and I wish to personally thank our loyal bartenders for working with us on this issue. If you see one of them Please thank them for helping VFW Post 3787 Canteen to remain solvent. They are just super people.

I want to state a few specifics about this change; after careful analysis I can assure you that if we had not taken these proactive actions VFW Post 3787 would have been on a direct path to closing the Canteen in the near future. We could not raise the price of drinks to even come close to covering all the associated costs with the minimum wage. The price increase would have been so large that we would have driven customers away. Next, there is nothing illegal with this business model change; we are about the last VFW Post in San Diego to move to volunteer bartenders and it is common throughout the Department of California. It is something private Veterans Clubs do routinely. Being totally candid, we will not know the results of this model change for a few months as the cost savings is coming from the associated costs of having employees. As the results become available, I will provide them to the entire membership.

I personally regret having to implement these changes as there are impacts on people but we could not find any other course of action and we are not completely sure it will solve the issue. Although I have had a few people comment on the change, no one to date has provided an alternative solution to the real fact that although we are solvent, we were on a path to having to close the canteen which functions for the membership. We did look at options like price increases, limiting hours, opening and closing times, size of drinks, etc. None of or any combination of resulted in the necessary fiscal changes to keep us from not closing the Canteen in the future.

I am completely open to discussing this with any member. I have and will continue to brief the membership at our monthly meetings. I sincerely hope that these changes result in the benefits we expect. Thanks, Your friendly Quartermaster Rick Tanner





Battle of Antietam:

Also known as the Battle of Sharpsburg fought on September 17, 1862, near Maryland and Antietam Creek was the first major battle in the American Civil War to take place on Union soil. It is the bloodiest single-day battle in American history, with 22,717 dead, wounded, and missing on both sides combined.

Native American Day:



September 27th This day is set aside to honor and celebrate Native Americans, the first Americans to live in the U.S. Still commonly referred to as American Indians, the term "Native Americans" has been used in recent years as a sign of respect and recognition that they were indeed the first people to populate our great and wonderful nation.



Navy Day:

In the United States, Navy Day is commonly celebrated on October 27th. This date was selected as it was the birth date of President Theodore Roosevelt, an avid supporter of the U.S. Navy. In the 1970's, research determined that the birthday of the U.S. Continental Navy was October 13, 1775. At the time, efforts were made to move Navy Day to this date. However, Navy Day in the United States, is still largely recognized as October 27th.

Columbus Day:

Columbus Day first became an official state holiday in Colorado in 1906, and became a federal holiday in the United States in 1937, though people have celebrated Columbus's voyage since the colonial period. In 1792, New York City and other U.S. cities celebrated the 300th anniversary of his landing in the New World. President Benjamin Harrison called upon the people of the United States to celebrate Columbus Day on the 400th anniversary of the event. During the four hundredth anniversary in 1892, teachers, preachers, poets and politicians used Columbus Day rituals to teach ideals of patriotism. These patriotic rituals were framed around themes such as support for war, citizenship boundaries, the importance of loyalty to the nation, and celebrating social progress. Many Italian-Americans observe Columbus Day as a celebration of their heritage, the first occasion being in New York City on October 12, 1866. Columbus Day was first

enshrined as a legal holiday in the United States through the lobbying of Angelo Noce, a first generation Italian, in Denver. The first



statewide Columbus Day holiday was proclaimed by Colorado governor Jesse F. McDonald in 1905, and it was made a statutory holiday in 1907. In April 1934, as a result of lobbying by the Knights of Columbus and New York City Italian leader Generoso Pope, Congress and President Franklin Roosevelt made October 12 a federal holiday under the name Volume 57, Issue #5
