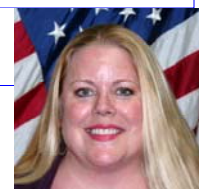

Greetings from the Quartermaster. The Solar project goes on, we have two contract bids and are attempting to find funding for the \$150,000.00. We are currently working with Navy Federal Credit Union to try to get at 20 year loan. We have received a commitment of \$2500.00 from the Men's Auxiliary and about \$1000.00 in donations from members. I thank everyone for their support. If you have a few free dollars The Post can use them for the solar project. If we do not actually get it accomplished, then your donation will be returned. I firmly believe the solar project savings will put the Post on a stable financial path for years to come. As I have said we pay SDGE around \$2000.00 a month for gas and electric. The Solar project will reduce that bill to around \$600.00 a month and will not have to deal with electric cost increases in the future (which SDGE always does). Please read the article on California Senate Bill SB 2. If you can contact Senator Anderson's office and tell him you support the measure. It will save VFW Posts a lot of money. Senator Anderson is trying to allow VFW Halls to be tax exempt for Property Taxes. Thanks, Your friendly Quartermaster Rick Tanner

Home Prescription Mail Delivery: Using military pharmacies to fill prescriptions continues to be free to beneficiaries, as well as generic formulary medications received through TRICARE's Pharmacy Home Delivery program. Remember... May 31 the Military Mail Order Program will cease. If you are using this program, you will have two options. (1) When you order refills (online or Telephone) you will have to select a pick up point for you to go get them or (2) register with Express Scripts (TRICARE's Pharmacy Home Delivery Program) which will mail (free of charge) your prescriptions. This means if you have prescriptions that you are refilling and having them mailed to you using a Military Pharmacy you will either have to pick them up at one of the 9 offered places or transfer your prescript to Express Scripts for filling. Express Scripts will still Mail to beneficiaries, but they charge fees for prescriptions from \$3 to \$27.

The U.S.S. Constitution ("Old Ironsides"), as a combat vessel, carried 48,600 gallons of fresh water for her crew of 475 officers and men. This was sufficient to last six months of sustained operations at sea. She carried no evaporators (i.e. fresh water distillers). According to her ship's log.... "On July 27, 1798, the U.S.S. Constitution sailed from Boston with a full complement of 475 officers and men, with 48,600 gallons of fresh water, 7,400 cannon shot, 11,600 pounds of black powder and 49,400 gallons of rum ." Her mission: "To destroy and harass English shipping."

Making Jamaica on 6 October, she took on 826 pounds of flour and 38,300 gallons of rum. Then she headed for the Azores , arriving there 12 November.. She provisioned with 550 pounds of beef and 14,300 gallons of Portuguese wine. On 18 November, she set sail for England . In the ensuing days, she defeated five British men-of-war ships, and captured and scuttled 12 English merchant ships, salvaging only the rum aboard each. By 26 January, her powder and shot were exhausted. Nevertheless, although unarmed she made a night raid up the Firth of Clyde in Scotland .. Her landing party captured a whisky distillery and transferred 20,000 gallons of single malt Scotch aboard by dawn. Then she headed home. The U. S. S. Constitution arrived in Boston Harbour on 20 February 1799, with no cannon shot, no food, no powder, no rum , no wine , no whisky , and 28,600 gallons of water .Navy example of saving water. GO NAVY!

Senator Anderson needs VFW Post 3787 assistance with SB 2.

SB 2, as amended, Anderson. Property taxation: exemptions: veterans' organizations.

Existing property tax law establishes a veterans' organization exemption under which property is exempt from taxation if, among other things, that property is used exclusively for charitable purposes and is owned by a veterans' organization.

This bill would provide that the veterans' organization exemption shall not be denied to a property on the basis that the property is used for fraternal, lodge, or social club purposes, and would make specific findings and declarations in that regard. The bill would also provide that the exemption shall not apply to any portion of a property that consists of a bar where alcoholic beverages are served.

VOICE OF DEMOCRACY Program

Theme – (Students in grades 9–12 on Nov 1, 2015) <http://www.vfw.org/VOD/> The 2015-16 theme is: **My Vision for America**. Students should record their reading of the draft to a CD. The recording can be no shorter than three minutes and no longer than five minutes (plus or minus five seconds). Once the student creates their essay and completes burning the audio version to a CD, they can submit their typed version, CD and the Voice of Democracy entry form to their local participating VFW Post by the November 1 deadline.

Quick Tips for Avoiding Fraud There are many varieties of consumer fraud, but the most common ones are variations of fake check scams, credit repair, free trip offers, and sweepstakes. Here are some tips to help you avoid being a victim:

- Don't give out personal information. Be suspicious of anyone you don't know who asks for your Social Security number, birth date, credit card number, bank account number, password, or other personal data.
- Don't be intimidated. Be suspicious of calls or e-mails that want you to provide or verify personal information immediately. Tell them you're not interested and hang up or don't reply to the e-mail.
- Monitor your accounts. Review bank and credit card statements carefully. Report unauthorized transactions to your financial institution immediately.
- Use a shredder. Tear or shred credit offers you receive in the mail, bank statements, insurance forms and other papers with personal information

Protect Your PIN

Beware of "shoulder surfers." Be suspicious of anyone lurking around an ATM or watching over your shoulder while you use your card. Some thieves even put a device over the card slot of an ATM to read the magnetic strip and record your PIN; this is known as "skimming". If you suspect criminal activity, walk away and use a different ATM.

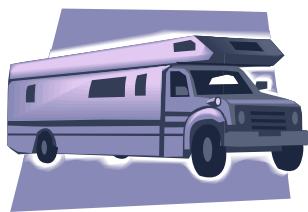
