TRICARE Pharmacy Copays to Increase

Starting Feb. 1, copayments for brand name drugs through TRICARE Home Delivery will increase from \$16 to \$20 for up to a 90-day supply. At retail pharmacies, generic drug copays go from \$8 to \$10, and brand name drug copays go from \$20 to \$24, for up to a 30-day supply. Copays for non-formulary drugs and for drugs at non-network pharmacies will also change. All drugs obtained from military pharmacies, and generic drugs through TRICARE Home Delivery, will still be at no cost to beneficiaries. TRICARE officials say beneficiaries can save up to \$208 for every brand name prescription drug if they switch from a retail pharmacy to TRICARE Home Delivery.

QUARTERMASTER'S REPORT

The Post still struggles with daily income, even after all the changes we have done the daily income is just making covering the cost of our bills. The goal is for the Canteen income to cover all the bills the Post incurs on a routine basis (vendors, gas/lights,

etc). We remain solvent but struggle a little at times. As reported at our last meeting our discretionary funds are low which means we can not do all the things we want to accomplish from a VFW Program approach. On the bright side, we are very close to having our Solar Funded. We should know next week at the latest. Our approach is centered on a State Program called HERO which allows us to pay the cost through our Property taxes which will increase by about \$10,500 per year. The loan will be at 6.5 percent which is a little high but the State Program can take advantage of the Federal Tax Rebate (which we can not because we are a non profit) which reduces the cost of the Project to us to \$112,700. It ends up as a break even process as if we borrow directly we have to borrow the entire cost of \$150,000. The installation of Solar will lower our SDGE bill a lot (right now around \$2000 a month). finalize all the contracts. I want to take a moment and thank all who support our Post Home, every time you have a meal, attend an event, or just have a libation it helps the Post. thank you. Late Update: On February 1 VFW Post 3787 signed the Contract for the HERO loan. You should expect to see activity within the next month with the installation being supervised by our Commander. I started this job saying I wanted to keep the Post out of debt, but I just put the Post in debt for \$112,000.00. It bothers me, however, I think it is the best course for the Post. We should end up saving a large amount of money. I thank all who helped start this project.

Mission Valley Fire Station 45 Open House: San Diego Fire-Rescue Department open house of Fire Station 45 February 20, 2016 The event will be held on Saturday, February 20th from 11:00 to 1:00 pm. Fire Station 45 is located at 9366 Friars Road in Mission Valley. Parking is available in the adjacent lot that is accessible off of Mission Village Drive. Residents can take a tour of the fire station and receive free CPR training from the Project Heart Beat organization. This Fire Station serves us and our area. It has been a long time coming.



Canteen Usage and entry. This is a complicated issue with a simple solution. On January 1 a law (Cal SB685)went into effect that impacts VFW Post 3787. The law states ,Veterans Clubs which is VFW Post 3787, The holder of a veterans' club license may exercise all of the rights and privileges permitted by an on-sale general license but may sell and serve alcoholic beverages for consumption within the licensed establishment only to bona fide members of the veterans' organization and their bona fide guests, bona fide members of other veterans' organizations, active duty or reserve members of the Armed Forces, or veterans as defined in Section 18540.4 of the Government Code. What is new is the addition of Veterans Organizations, active duty or reserve members of the Armed Forces or Veterans. The Secretary of State put the law into California Government Code. The ABC sent a memo to its agents saying it will no longer check Veterans Clubs for membership or the use of a Guest Log.

Now what!!! VFW Post 3787 will have to decide how to handle Canteen Usage based on the guidance above as we set our own rules on the usage of the Canteen. What we can not do is get into a discrimination issue on the implementation. Right now it is entry as usual for members, Auxiliary, and guests. VFW Post 3787 can remain this way or open our canteen to members of any Veterans Organization, Active Duty and Veterans. The Canteen Bartender would as a person for proof of membership like a VA card, retired Card, membership card in Veteran's Museum, or any Veterans Organization (AMVETS, American Legion, DAV, Purple Hearts, etc) then serve the customer. This has the potential to add revenue to the Canteen.

This will be our choice so you need to give your thoughts and ideas to the Commander who can bring them to the VFW Post meeting. It is a radical change in who uses the canteen. There has been some discussion this opens VFW Posts to the Public, that is not the case nor is it allowed by law. We have to be careful we do not put our Non Profit Status in any kind of jeopardy.
